ARNE GRAFF, M.D.

Medical Director of Sanford CARE Clinic, Fargo, ND

Dr. Arne Graff is a Pediatrician who completed his fellowship in Child Abuse and Forensic Pediatrics at Brown University Medical School in Rhode Island. He is the chair of Pediatric and Adolescent Medicine and the Division of Child Abuse at Mayo in Rochester, MN. Dr. Graff is a member of many Boards and Societies that focus on the care of victims of child abuse. He served as the Medical Director of the Sanford Child Adolescent Maltreatment Services Department in Fargo, ND from 2007 to 2014. Dr. Graff was reappointed as Medical Director of the Sanford CARE Clinic in Fargo in January 2017.

MICHAEL MCGEE, M.D.

Medical Examiner, MN

Dr. Michael McGee is the Medical Examiner for Ramsey and Washington County as well as a number of counties in greater Minnesota including Clay and Wilkin County. Dr. McGee began his practice as a Coroner's Pathologist in the Ramsey County Coroner's Office in 1979 and reorganized the office into a Medical Examiner system before being appointed the Medical Examiner in 1985. The office is currently accredited by NAME (National Association of Medical Examiners) and IACME (International Association of Coroners and Medical Examiners.) Investigators are trained and certified by AMBDI (American Board of Medicolegal Death Investigators.)

NANCY SANDERS HARPER, M.D.

Medical Director

Nancy Sanders Harper is the Medical Director for the Otto Bremer Trust Center for Safe and Healthy Children at the University of Minnesota Masonic Children's Hospital and Hennepin County Medical Center. Dr. Harper is Board Certified in General Pediatrics and Child Abuse Pediatrics. Dr. Harper graduated from Dartmouth Medical School in 1995, and completed her pediatric residency in 1998 at Naval Medical Center Portsmouth in Virginia. After graduation, Dr. Harper served as a staff pediatrician and Child Abuse Consultant for Naval Medical Center Portsmouth and US Naval Hospital Okinawa in Japan. In 2004, Dr. Harper resigned from the US Navy and entered into fellowship training in Forensic Pediatrics at Brown University in RI, graduating in January 2007. Dr. Harper then served as the Medical Director for the CARE Team at Driscoll Children's Center of Excellence (79th Legislature) tasked with the development of guidelines for designating regional centers of excellence for child abuse in Texas. Governor Perry appointed Dr. Harper to the statewide Blue Ribbon Task Force to Reduce Child Abuse and Neglect (81st Legislature SB 1154). The Task Force was legislatively charged with addressing child abuse prevention and the promotion of child well-being for the state of Texas. Dr. Harper currently serves as the programming chair for the AAP Section on Child Abuse and Neglect (SOCAN) and is invested in improving educational opportunities on child maltreatment both nationally and internationally.

CORY JEWELL JENSEN, M.S.

Cory Jewell Jensen, M.S., is currently the senior trainer for CBI Consulting and has spent the last 35 years providing evaluation and treatment services to adult sex offenders and their families in Portland, Oregon. In addition to her clinical work, Ms. Jensen has provided training and consultation services to the National Center for the Prosecution of Child Abuse, The National Child Advocacy Center, The National Children's Alliance, The United States Navy, The National Crime Victims Association, The National Boy Scouts Foundation, The Mark McGwire Foundation for Children, US Marshall's Office, NYPD Special Victims Unit and a number of law enforcement, child advocacy and faith based organizations. Ms. Jensen served as Executive Director for the Association for the Treatment of Sexual Abusers, chaired two of ATSA's International research and Treatment Conferences and served as President of Oregon's Chapter of ATSA. She also chaired the Offender Management Committee attached to the Oregon Attorney General's Sexual Assault Task Force, has been an instructor for Portland State University's Child Welfare Training Institute for the past 15 years and provided training for countless Multidisciplinary Teams through the United States. Ms. Jensen has been the recipient of Oregon's "Commercial Crime Prevention Award," the "Champions for Children Award," the OATSA "Significant Achievement Award," the Nunnenkamp "Award of Excellence," and the Jan Hindman Memorial Award. Ms. Jensen has published a number of articles related to sex offender treatment, risk management and child abuse prevention, testified as an expert witness in local and federal courts and has been a featured guest on radio talk shows as well as the Oprah Winfrey Show.
